The Faculty members presented their Course Outlines for Trimester II and Trimester III of the LLM course. The members of the BOS actively participated in detailed review of individual Course Outlines submitted by respective faculty members. Learned Members suggested several amendments/changes as well as insertion of certain new modules in some of the Course Outlines. Following is a summary of the modifications recommended by them:

The Board recommended that after due incorporations of the changes suggested by the learned Members, all Course Outlines may be submitted to the Academic Council meeting for approval.



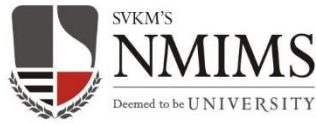

The Board recommended that after due incorporations of the changes suggested by the learned Members, all Course Outlines may be submitted to the Academic Council meeting for approval.




