

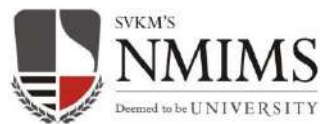

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iii) Consideration and approval of New Course Structure, New Teaching Scheme of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) & B.B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Program (Semester I to X) for the Batch 2023- 28 from the A.Y. 2023-24 onwards.

The Dean Dr Durgambini Patel briefly explained the design of the new course structure of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) & B.B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Program (Semester I to X) for the Batch 2023-28 from the A.Y. 2023-24 onwards, to the BoS members along with the division of credits. The overall credits were reduced to 208 from 253. This agenda item was further anchored by Dr Rakesh Nambiar, Program Chair of B.A. LL.B. (Hons.). The BoS members appreciated the reduction in credits & the new Course Structure planned. In this regard, Mr. Harshal Shah (Mentor) strongly suggested that the reduction of credits and subjects in the new Course Structure tabled, can be planned for reframing the course structures of existing batches. In this regard, the internal BoS Committee of KPMSOL will brainstorm to see the alignment of existing course structures with the New Course Structure.

iv) Revised ICA Policy with changes in ICA components for existing & new Courses (Both in UG & PG Programs) from the A.Y. 2023-24 onwards in view of the decision taken by the Board of Examinations for NMIMS University.

The Dean Dr Durgambini Patel informed the members that at the Dean's Council meeting conducted by NMIMS Board of Examinations dated 27 Feb 2023, it was decided to revise the ICA components in all Schools of NMIMS University. The Research Project component to be removed from the existing ICA, in response to the student usage of AI platforms like ChatGPT that is known for non-original content creation, and which also deceives plagiarism softwares. This component is replaced with a mid-term test as ICA. Accordingly, the revised ICA was presented to the BoS (revised as per University guidelines):

Components	Marks

The revised ICA components along with the guidelines were approved by the BoS members for the existing batches as well as the new batch, without any change.

v) Introduction of Tutorial Guidelines as per new UG course structure from the A.Y. 2023-24 onwards.

As per BCI Regulations, Schedule III - clause 18, it is mandatory to conduct tutorials for all courses. Accordingly, Tutorial guidelines were presented in the BoS meeting which were approved by the BoS members.

vi) Discussion of Faculty workload for U.G. Programs as per new Course Structure Batch 2023-28, as per BCI guidelines from the A.Y. 2023-24 onwards.

With reference to the BCI Regulations, Schedule III - clause 18, as tutorials are to be conducted mandatorily for all courses in the new course structure batch 2023-28. The BoS members were informed about the additional faculty workload generated due to additional tutorial hrs. added to the existing workload of the faculty for every course. The BoS members acknowledged the change in the faculty workload.


