1. Movie Night: Screening of the movie 'Aligarh'



The event received a fair amount of attention as our promotional posts were viewed by Ritviz, an Indian singer, musician and youtuber and Prime, an American pop musician and LGBTQ+ activist. Pehchaan was successful is bringing on board Arya Senapati, a famous queer activist, social worker and MUNer of Odisha.

2. Celebration: Hindi Diwas


