INTERVIEWER

What are new things you would like to incorporate in the student council for this academic year? KANISHKA BUBNA

I want to introduce a better process or mechanism to get budgets passed and events conducted. I would also want to increase the involvement of committee heads in the working of the student council, as they are not only heads of their respective committees but also de facto members of the student council. We are also planning on reintroducing the buddy system this year, which is a mentor-mentee program aimed at helping juniors with academics, internships, and other queries they may have. Due to the difference in sizes of the batches, it will take some time to figure out the logistics, but we hope to implement it soon. I would also like to organise more workshops and counselling sessions by professionals in the legal field.

How different will your approach be from what it was last year, especially regarding the online to offline transition?

KANISHKA BUBNA

Most of the announcements were made online last year. We will be continuing with that this year as well due to the varied timings of all the batches. However, the student council members will be hosting more offline meetings to increase in-person interaction.

INTERVIEWER

What is the one thing that you hope to achieve for the committee by the end of the academic year?

KANISHKA BUBNA

By the end of the year, I hope to have implemented the buddy system so that it runs smoothly. I would also like to ensure that everyone is involved in organising events. I have also noticed that many students are unaware of how things work. So, by the end of the year, I am looking to train a set of students so that they can spread awareness and provide clarification on such matters.

INTERVIEWER

What are new things you would like to incorporate in the student council for this academic year?

year? OJASWI BHAGAT

Firstly, inclusivity. I feel like it is very important. There have been incidents where students who come from different states and have different accents face a lot of abuse. Since we have a larger batch this year, I would like to ensure that we maintain an inclusive environment. That is where the new committees come into play – the Equity Committee, the Anti-ragging Committee, the Gender Sensitization Committee – and I feel like this is a very positive change. We also plan on increasing publicity for important notifications like the Constitution. To be more approachable, we are planning on circulating anonymous forms to address the grievances of the students.

INTERVIEWER

How different will your approach be from what it was last year, especially regarding the online to offline transition?

OJASWI BHAGAT

The major change from online to offline college is accommodation. We will be looking to assist students with that. We would also like to ensure that more opportunities are given to students regarding internships in particular. In terms of discipline, we plan on enforcing a stringent policy for daily decorum. Students engaging in misconduct on college premises shall be liable to strict punishments. We will be a lot more vigilant in this area.

INTERVIEWER

What is the one thing that you hope to achieve for the committee by the end of the academic year?

OJASWI BHAGAT

By the end of the year, I hope we have a more inclusive atmosphere in the law school. We hope to have a prolific year with a lot of events, with a lot of student activities, but our main focus is to create a system wherein everyone's voice is heard.

INTERVIEWER

What are new things you would like to incorporate in the student council for this academic year? JAI NAKRA


INTERVIEWER

SHRUTI SAMDARIA



What do you think about the Equity Committee that has been started this year and how would you go about building it?



INTERVIEWER

What do you think about the Anti-Ragging Committee that has been started this year and how would you go about building it?

AMRUTA GIJARE

I believe an anti-ragging committee is important in college but KPMSOL has always had an extremely healthy senior-junior relationship, where everyone has equal footing. I remember from my very first year, I could easily approach any fifth years, easily talk to them. I remember being able to approach fifth years in my first year and have a conversation. They facilitated this environment by asking them to address us with their names to establish equality. My main focus as a member of the anti-ragging committee would be to continue with the culture we have. It is incumbent upon us to take it forward, to ensure it is spread and remains the way it is-seniors and juniors remain on an equal footing.

INTERVIEWER

How different will your approach be from what it was last year, especially regarding the online to offline transition? What is the one thing you hope to achieve for your committee by the end of the academic year?

I will be focusing on establishing a better mooting culture in the college because I believe that mooting is vital for every law college and currently there is a lot of room for the mooting culture to grow. Students are allotted moots and end up skipping because they do not have the support system needed. They need mentors and seminars, and our goal is to provide them access. We are refining the allotment system to make it more accessible to newcomers.

Further, as far as the International Moot Court Competition is concerned, we will try to reach out to more international teams and judges. As far as the moot problems are concerned, we will try to tap into pressing issues. For instance, last year with IMCC, we tapped into the Russia-Ukraine issue, which is why we had a criminal base for the problem. The moot issue is one place where we can really express the contemporaneous concerns, and our moot problems will be reflective of that. In addition, while we create our moot problem, we will make sure it is equitable to students of all years.

Earlier, it was a hybrid system and now we are completely transitioning into offline. So, our focus would be on becoming more digitally evolved and being environment-friendly, as these two things go hand in hand. Digitization will reduce paperwork and we can associate ourselves with brands that are more nature friendly.
